City

- Hosted meeting with Michigan Municipal League (MML) to discuss Health in All Policies Approach (HiAP) and Saginaw transportation improvement. Attended by Health and Social Equity members, Manager, Saginaw County Board of Commissioners Chair, and STARS Executive Director
- The New Ezekiel Project of Saginaw led the charge in outreach for the August 2015 Saginaw City transportation millage renewal by distributing over 1500 pieces of literature to community partners and over 15 congregations. Along with a social media campaign, this millage renewal passed with 75% support, 10% more than it's ever garnered before.
- Health and Social Equity members (with Ezekiel as lead) attended multiple Michigan Power to Thrive meetings held in Lansing. Jamie Forbes provided a presentation on transportation needs during an August MPTT thrive meeting. Saginaw's delegation also selected to join other MPTT to work on "Mass incarceration as a public health crisis" during the August MPTT

ACTION GROUP HIGHLIGHTS



Emerging Models of Health Services Delivery Health Action Group:

- Saginaw Community Care Hub "the Hub" received "no cost extension" for adult Hub to operate until June 30, 2016 . St. Mary's of Michigan adopted model for Community Health Workers (CHW) and will continue to employ CHWs. HDI has a grant to fund a CHWs at Jane Street prenatal care centers.
- Article featuring the unique relationship between Saginaw MMR and Saginaw Hub to reduce unnecessary ED transports was featured on the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) web site: <https://innovations.ahrq.gov/profiles/community-health-worker-agencies-partner-emergency-medical-service-providers-identify>.
- Budget for Saginaw Children's Healthcare Access Program (CHAP) has been approved and CHAP Coordinator hired. The expected "go live" date for the Saginaw CHAP implementation phase was February 2016.
- Saginaw County Enrollment Advocacy Network (SCEAN) has implemented a brand campaign to support community partners in outreach efforts to ensure people understand importance of becoming insured, staying insured and using health care insurance to stay healthy. The campaign is entitled, "Get it. Keep it. Use it." SCCMHA funded the design of a logo.



Infant Mortality Action Group:

- Covenant started grandparents/caregivers safety class.
- Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS) Conference was held in April 17.
- Focus Areas identified through Safe Sleep Disparities, 40 Weeks of Pregnancy, Covenant Binder
- Infant Mortality Action Group reformed under the Saginaw Fetal Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) Team.



Chronic Diseases Action Group:

- 24 of 36 participants completed the 2015 YMCA health challenge.
- Covenant incorporated diabetic foot screening into diabetes health fair, developed a PAD consumer flyer, and started an amputee support group.
- Friend for Recovery and "Better Together We Can" program implemented.
- St. Mary's partnered with Community Mental Health to provide PATH for Chronic Disease Workshops for Mentally ill clients.
- CMH provided a trainer once a week for YMCA PATH participants.
- CMU, MSU-extension, and St. Mary's of Michigan held a year-long Diabetes Prevention Classes (DPP).
- CMH Health Home has added a Dietitian to address weight management goals.



Obesity (Step Up Saginaw) Action Group:

- 3 employers in Saginaw County trained on CDC Work@Health worksite wellness Program
- Over 250 classrooms received nutrition education
- Over 5,000 adults received nutrition education
- 20 people completed 1-year diabetes prevention class



Behavioral Health Action Group:

- 30 Trauma Informed Community Events held to date
- 870 Individuals in Saginaw Trained in Mental Health First Aid (Adult and Youth Curriculums)
- Saginaw Hoarding Task Force Initiated in 2015
- Local Saginaw Substance Use Disorder Integration Completed
